

Catalyst:Ed's SEA Exchange works with visionary state leaders and teams to help them access the trusted expertise and agile talent they seek to address learner needs, support their Local Education Agencies, and invest in longer-term transformation. Launched in Jan 2022 with five states, the SEA Exchange is ready to initiate its second cohort with ten states nationally.

EXPANDING TEAM CAPACITY. AMPLIFYING IMPACT.

Catalyst:Ed works with SEAs to help them access the expertise, insights, and additional capacity they need to further their priorities and transform their practices. Services and solutions offered by the SEA Exchange include the following:



Individualized capacity-building supports: Our signature matching process, trusted by over 1,000 state and local education agencies and nonprofits, delivers intentional, high-quality and seamless support that is responsive to the needs and contexts of each agency.



Philanthropically-funded consulting wallets: Each state has access to a pre-funded wallet of \$50,000 that can be used to make rapid progress on critical priorities identified by the state. These wallets can also be added to by local funders. Catalyst:Ed will manage all contracts and payments related to the wallets.



Targeted connections with role-alike peers: Cohort meetings provide state leaders and teams an opportunity to discuss common challenges and share insights. States can also request 1:1 connections with peers working on similar issues.



Advisory Support: Each state has an assigned Relationship Manager, who will be responsible for understanding the state's needs and priorities, connecting state officials to Exchange services and solutions, and ensuring projects are successful.

Cohort 1 was launched in Jan 2022 with five participating states (Colorado, District of Columbia, Louisiana, New Mexico, and Texas). States accessed support to identify learning acceleration strategies, support a statewide taskforce to support students with disabilities, develop a virtual school governance framework, optimize technical assistance programming for LEAs, and more. Additionally, states also leveraged support to build internal capabilities through projects focused on performance management and the collection and use of data. The SEA Exchange's **second cohort will start in May 2023** and run through to April 2024. Cohort 2 of the SEA Exchange has a limited number of seats available for “expansion” states who did not participate in Cohort 1. Participation criteria include:

- Urgency around meeting the needs of historically marginalized student groups
- Consistent engagement from a senior agency leader (usually a Deputy Superintendent or Managing Director who has insight into work across departments; expected time commitment 1-2 hours per month) and additional staff as need (approx. 8-10 hours over the year)
- Willing to share their own wisdom / experiences and learn from those of others
